2022 BURGUNDY OFFER



INTRODUCING THE YEAR

There is perhaps a quiet air of jubilation about the Burgundy 2022 vintage as vigneronns up and down the region reflect on a season that passed without the challenges and trauma of the years that immediately preceded it – the unrelenting heat of 2020 against a backdrop of isolation in the wake of a pandemic, that was duly followed by a 2021 season ravaged by deep and damaging frosts causing havoc in many forms.

That is not to say for a moment that 2022 was without its challenges. This is certainly a vintage that rigidly confirms that Burgundy is advancing through an era of unprecedented climate change, with increasing sunshine hours, rising average seasonal temperatures, and declining year-on-year availability of precious groundwater – all lending evidence to substantiate the fact that we are experiencing profound change.

The difference then, is in the way these challenges are being met, and there is a sense across the region that advances in viticultural techniques and technical know-how, as well as the benefit of human experience cascading down to more new generations of winemakers – as is the very essence of the region itself – have reached a zenith that has never before left the region so well-equipped for the future.

No previous generation of Burgundy winemakers have enjoyed the formal education and international preparatory experience that the current crop have had, and today their era-defining challenge is clear, and it is to find a way to produce classical, exceptional Burgundy from seasons which are the new normal – with heat and drought, unpredictable frost risk, earlier pick dates and unprecedented weather patterns.

On the evidence of the 2022 vintage – this is a challenge being risen to and met with undaunted aplomb.

IN THE FIELDS

From start to finish this was a season that passed by with a refreshing lack of tension in contrast with recent years – no anxious wait for a rain that doesn't arrive as in 2020, or any need to pick up pieces and re-calibrate objectives after the destructive frosts of 2021 obliterated yield forecasts early on. Full cellars were the order of the day for 2022 and nature kindly delivered fulsome buckets of fruit at season end!

The year began with ample groundwater reserves from the 2021 winter season, and although the winter passed much more mildly than even a decade ago – as is the new normal – the vines did not stir into budburst until more or less the expected time, towards the end of March. Slow and measured early growth was then in line with general expectations for the region moving through the month of April.

As is typical, April did not pass without the risk of frost and for a short stint in the middle of the month many vigneronns were on alert as the skies cleared and temperatures sharply dipped – fortunately this period did not produce any sustained cold snap and not every producer had to reach for the candles or turbines. Any losses were marginal and isolated, allowing relief and excitement for the year to stir.



The remainder of the season passed with precious little drama, warm and dry conditions providing an ideal environment for the development of plentiful, healthy fruit – although June did bring with it some isolated examples of unusual weather. Gevrey-Chambertin endured serious torrential rain in late June, causing some flooding and serious mudslides, and Chambolle-Musigny saw some remarkable hailstorms.

The rains of June however topped up the soils perfectly in order for the vines to more or less endure a hot and dry July and August – although some cover crops were sacrificed for the vines' water supply, and vineyard teams had to adopt a careful and labour-intensive programme of leaf stripping and shading to protect ripening fruit against sunburn in areas, and slow a rapid ripening that could upset fruit balance.

Late summer showers arrived at the perfect moment ahead of picking in the last week of August, plumping up berries and diluting sugars in the fruit to reduce the potential of too high alcohol levels.

THE PERFECT PICK

More or less every domaine had at least begun picking by the last week of August – in fact some of them even had all their fruit in the winery by the arrival of September! Several have noted that the widely regarded as typical ‘one hundred days’ from flowering to harvest can now be closer to the ninety-day mark, a significant shift for Burgundy and a development that drives the innovation of vineyard managers.

Yields were plentiful with most domaines able to produce cuvees close to the maximum yield limit for each respective appellation rulebook, without expending any quality whatsoever, a very welcome increase on the 2021 output which for many producers was less than half of a typical year and an economic burden for many which would, if repeated, certainly place a strain on even the broadest of shoulders.

In the dry conditions, rot and disease were pretty much non-existent, and careful vineyard management meant very little raisining or dried fruit entering the winery. Many producers noted that the fruit sorters had a pleasantly easy year, having to intervene very little as grapes rattled along the conveyor belts into the destemmers, or directly into the tanks – the use of whole bunches in ferments a talking point as ever.

Fruit with balanced acidity and typical Burgundian amounts of sugar – to produce wines of 12.5% to 13.5% typically – was widely reported throughout the region, to the delight and relief of every producer.

VINIFICATION

We have heard very few reports of any difficulty in the cellars of our portfolio of producers – vinification proceeded more or less without obstacles for all, with cool autumn cellars providing ideal conditions for slow and controlled fermentations and malolactic conversions where employed, and the superb balance of the fruit arriving in the cellar demanded very little adjustment beyond a little acidification with tartaric.

Picking times were generally very carefully managed so the fruit profile of the white wines remains in a typical citrus and white fruit arena, where many expected some more tropically profiled wines to emerge from the summer sunshine. Likewise the red wines are crisp and delicate in their fruit profile – testament to the great efforts of vineyard managers up and down the region. Concentration however is remarkable.

And it is because of the fabulous concentration of the fruit that this will truly be a vintage to savour. A few producers have slightly increased the use of new oak in use in the cellar for the top wines, believing that the intensity of the flavour here can handle it. Others have reduced the use of new oak to allow the purity of the fruit flavour to shine through, much in line with the trend of the region over more recent vintages.

Another trend which has sustained is the reduction of more aggressive extraction techniques, with many domaines excluding punch-downs and relying more on gentle pump-overs – or simply gently rolling barrels where the ferment and skin contact is taking place in wood. The goal here is to protect fresh aromatics and ensure only the finest tannins are extracted, making the wines more approachable in their youth.

Perhaps the biggest talking point from this vintage is the use of whole bunches in the ferment, a topic which is dividing opinion. The presence of ripe wood stems in the ferment adds a little tannic structure but also soaks up some colour compounds and can reduce acids – and the intra-cellular fermentation that takes place inside whole berries provides some lifted floral and fruity aromatics and a softness of texture.



This is a topic to keep an eye on as some believe the use of whole bunches contributes to – rather than detracts from – the objective of offering the best expressions of terroir. Armand Heitz says the below:

'For the reds, my credo is a whole bunch harvest. I have a de-stemmer but I think I am going to sell it as I have hardly ever used it. Optical sorters and the like are worth a fortune and make me nauseous. Emmanuel Reynaud fills his Grenache vats with a harvesting pump from the 1980s and make some of the most sought-after wines in the world.' – Armand Heitz (Chassagne-Montrachet), *Vintage Report 2022*

CHARDONNAY AND FRIENDS

In summary, the white wines from 2022 provide a real treat for those both well-versed and new to white Burgundy – wines with intensity and drive, beautiful purity and trademark minerality, and wines often likened to the very well-regarded 2017 vintage. The wines really are classical Burgundy in style, with poise, restraint and remarkable elegance, and will certainly reward careful cellaring for years to come.

Beyond Chardonnay – the increasing availability of Aligoté bottlings from a number of estates are also well worth a look in as a point of interest. The quality of these wines has been rising steadily over the last decade and the variety is increasing in popularity with makers as it is well-equipped to handle changing climate conditions. The wines are ever more textured, rich and cellarable – and are well worth re-visiting.



FABULOUS RED WINES

The red wines from 2022 have widely been lauded as a return to the elegance of longer ago vintages such as 2010 and 2012 – both very highly regarded – and a move away from the generally more forward style that has characterised vintages such as 2018 and 2020. The wines are bright and concentrated but full of the nuance and sophistication that Burgundy lovers seek, and these wines offer some serious longevity.

We should here also really applaud the efforts of the growers and vineyard managers up and down the region for their efforts in controlling the famously fickle Pinot Noir in what are increasingly challenging conditions – for in such a warm and sun-drenched season, to produce wines with such elegance, and to produce wines with both modern approachability and traditional ageability, is a serious achievement.

IN CONCLUSION

This vintage is one that feels all about the changing of the guard, into a new world of fresh questions, as many new and bright young winemakers are taking their places at the top table of a number of estates and are playing their part in defining the approach to truly unprecedented climate-related challenges.

In combination with a vintage that has yielded truly exceptional and classical wines that will offer a serious amount of pleasure in the short term and for years to come, makes this a vintage to remember.

We are truly excited about these wines, and we very much look forward to sharing them all with you.

13 TERMS AND CONDITIONS

❖ 1 - CHABLIS

Chablis is the far northern outpost of Burgundy. Located some 160 kilometres north of the Côte d'Or, this marginal, cool-climate sub-region cultivates its geographical and geological differences with the rest of Burgundy. Its Kimmeridgian and Portlandian clay-and-limestone soils, rich with marine fossils, are key to the flinty, mineral character for which Chablis is world famous.

There is a great deal of excitement about the wines emerging from Burgundy's 2022 vintage and this certainly includes the northern sub-region of Chablis, where satisfaction is perhaps more the sweeter because of the feeling that they got away with it by the skin of their teeth – being the only sub-region to endure a proper frost scare in April that left many fearing a repeat of the devastation of 2021!



What has now emerged from 2022 ticks all the boxes to keep everyone happy – growers, winemakers, importers and wine lovers alike – with plentiful yields of superbly attractive wines that combine the best of classical and modern Chablis: crisp minerality, trademark salinity and electric structure, overlaid with fresh citrus and orchard fruit, and some just-ripe stone fruit.

In tune with the rest of the region this was a warm, dry and sunny vintage with some water stress and periods of excessive heat, which led many to think this could be a vintage of reduced acidity and ripe, round fruit – but what has emerged is much more traditional in style, testament to the manner in which growers are tackling our changing climate with innovation. Low frost damage, perfect luck with the arrivals of rain, and the precise timing of harvests combined to yield abundant and well-proportioned fruit that have made for balanced, exciting, and truly memorable wines.



❖ 1.1 - Domaine Jean Collet & Fils

Lutte Raisonnée - Certified Organic

One of the great multi-generational families of Chablis, the Collet family have been making wine in this region since 1792, and the domaine itself was established in 1952 by Jean Collet, with the first domaine-bottled offerings emerging two years later in 1954. His grandson, Romain, is now firmly at the helm and has overseen each vintage since returning to Chablis and joining his parents in 2008. Romain studied winemaking in Beaune and, like many of his generation, worked abroad including in wineries in New Zealand, honing and developing winemaking skills and abilities.

The Collet estate comprises more than thirty-five hectares of vines with parcels in the Grands Crus Valmur and Les Clos; 1ers Crus Montée de Tonnerre, Mont de Milieu, Montmains, Vaillons, Sécher and Butteaux; plus well-known lieux-dit 'Les Truffières' as well as AOCs Chablis and Petit Chablis. Bourgogne Rouge and Sauvignon de Saint-Bris are also produced.

The family have tended to their vines historically according to *lutte raisonnée* principles which limit the usage of phytosanitary treatments to the absolute minimum necessary, and they have now successfully converted twelve hectares of their vineyards to fully certified organic viticulture. Harvests start early and at midnight – a practice used by Romain since 2018, where an army of pickers descends on the vineyards overnight and hand-picks the fruit at the coolest possible temperatures, preserving delicate aromatics and trademark, razor-like acidity – concluding at 11:00am.



JEAN COLLET & FILS SAUVIGNON de SAINT BRIS 2022

A fragrant nose, very herbaceous. Grassy, herbal, and lean with refreshing minerality.

JEAN COLLET & FILS ALIGOTÉ 2022

A new wine from a limestone-rich site near Irancy. Grapey and floral, with citrus fruit on the palate. High acidity and more aromatic than you'd expect, with a broad body. Due to the warmer temperatures Aligoté here is changing – less acidic and lean, thus a different prospect!

JEAN COLLET & FILS CHABLIS 2022

Bright, lifted and steely. A blend from parcels between Vaillons and Montmains, from Kimmeridgian sites at the backside of the 1ers Crus. Average vine age is around 45. The wine has focused energy and high acidity with grapefruit pith, lemon juice and delicate minerality.

JEAN COLLET & FILS PETIT CHABLIS 2022

A delicate nose showing pear fruit and green apples too. The Petit Chablis parcel is on the plateau at Villy (nearby the village of Chablis). This is bright and lifted with good energy and feels jolly! Simple, but very satisfying with clearly defined fruit and a refreshing dry finish.

JEAN COLLET & FILS
CHABLIS 1er CRU MONTMAINS 2022

From four hectares of 60–65-year-old vines, manually harvested, this wine is labour intensive (expensive to make) but shows off the best of the site. 100% vinified in stainless steel, the wine shows pear, crisp apple and solid minerality. An energetic wine with a long, satisfying finish.

CHABLIS 1er CRU MONTEE DE TONNERRE 2022

Pear fruit, whetstone and flint with green apples and white flowers. Something herbal here as well, and honeysuckle. Salinity, with great length, mouth-watering acidity and generally very focused, clear and crisp, with tension and a long, long finish on the palate. A lovely wine.

JEAN COLLET & FILS
CHABLIS 1er CRU VAILLONS 2022

Aged for 10–12 months in a mixture of stainless steel, oak barrels and large foudres, this is delicious and classic Chablis reminiscent of oysters and sea salty fare. Steely and focused with flint, tart apple and grapefruit, and the faintest hint of struck match lending complexity.

JEAN COLLET & FILS
CHABLIS VALMUR GRAND CRU 2022


This is 100% barrel-aged in 2–3-year-old French oak for 11 months and shows a hint of spicy anise on the nose. A big mouthfeel – broad, rich and classy. Good weight in the mid-palate and full of energy – a long finish with minerality, spice and stone fruit, and remarkable freshness.

Bright, lean and crisp with some crunchy cherries and raspberries. Some tart cranberry notes too – but a creamy texture balances the high acidity and fruity freshness – and with 30% of the wine aged in new French oak, fine touches of spice lend the wine a delightful complexity.

❖ 1.2 - Domaine Jean Dauvissat Père & Fils

Organic and Biodynamic Practices in use

Since we first started working with this domaine in 2013, Fabien Dauvissat has consistently produced excellent, trademark Chablis that offer superb value for money – and since the 2020 vintage the bottles too have been incredibly beautiful, issued with wax tops and a new label design featuring sketches of the domaine's various vineyards.


Fabien works everything by hand wherever possible and has also been practicing organic viticulture since 2014. After submitting his application for certified conversion back in 2018, the first fully certified organic vintage from Dauvissat is on the horizon. The land has also been worked with a biodynamic philosophy since 2019 and the team proudly oversee the expansion of biodiversity within the vineyards, with plantings of herbs and vegetables increasing all the time. Biodynamic certification is also very much on the radar for the future.

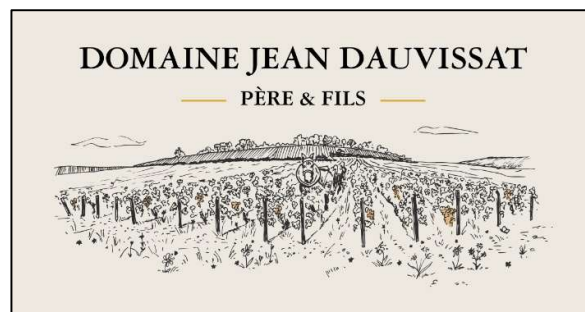
Spread over fifty-three individual parcels of vines that together extend to over twenty-two hectares, this is a sprawling estate that produces an exquisite array of bottlings. The domaine's fruit is carefully sorted and vinified only ever in stainless steel tanks, and the wines are then aged over a relatively long period before bottling. The village level wines are allowed to harmonise for eighteen months prior to release, and the premiers crus for up to two years – to ensure settled, characterful wines with elegance, finesse and a balanced, well-integrated structure of acidity.



JEAN DAUVISSAT PÈRE & FILS CHABLIS TERROIRS de la CHAPELLE 2022


From diverse vineyards around the town of La Chapelle Vaupelteigne with 35-year-old vines and soils of marl, limestone and clay, this is an expression of Chablis with a subtle richness, notable freshness and minerality, bursting with just ripe lemon and saline oyster shell characteristics. Also partly matured in demi-muids which lends a very fine roundness to the wine.

JEAN DAUVISSAT PÈRE & FILS CHABLIS MONTMAIN SOURDELLE 2022

This wine is from two hectares of plots in the vineyards of Mont-Main and Sourdele, in the town of Beines, classified as Chablis AOC but with vines that yield fruit with marked aromatic intensity and vibrant flavours. This cuvee is aged sur lie and matured in large demi muids which also lend the wine softness of body and a subtle, savoury complexity on the palate.

JEAN DAUVISSAT PÈRE & FILS CHABLIS HERITAGE 2022

From deep-rooted old vines across more than seventeen hectares of Chablis AOC this is a wonderful expression of the appellation, assembled from multiple cuvees each lending the wine their individual characteristics. This is fresh and delicate with crisp acidity and trademark minerality, with beautifully defined flavours of citrus fruit and crunchy green apples.

Virginie Moreau has been at the helm of this twenty-six hectare domaine since the summer of 2016 when husband Stéphane unexpectedly passed away, just two years after opening their new cellar-winery just outside the Golden Gate of Burgundy. Her parents previously ran the village restaurant in Irancy, *Le Soufflot*, and she herself became a vigneron by trade working alongside Stéphane.

Producing some of the most well-regarded wines in the region thanks to delicate handling, prolonged élevage and light filtration – the Moreau-Naudet portfolio spans a broad range of the most sought-after crus of Chablis, including a coveted slice of the Grand Cru plot of Valmur. The premiers crus on offer include Vaillons, Montmains and Foret as well as Montee de Tonnerre, and the lieux-dit of 'Les Pargues' offers exceptional value for money alongside the village wine and Petit Chablis.



DOMAINE MOREAU-NAUDET CHABLIS 2022

A broad fruit profile full of citrusy zest, tart grapefruit, pineapple juice and with a crisp mineral energy. Plenty of salinity and bracing acidity, and bone dry with a long and classic finish – this wine is very well structured and very finely balanced with a fresh and lifted character. Great value.

A popular portfolio wine from an old vine parcel, with a 75-year-old average age. Very interesting nose, slightly grassy with citrus, fennel and a leafy character – fresh and herbal, tighter overall on the nose and palate than the village Chablis and would highly reward a short period of cellaring.

DOMAINE MOREAU-NAUDET CHABLIS 1er CRU BEAUREGARD 2022

First Vintage!

A brand-new wine for 2022, from the 1er Cru Beauregard plot – a cool climate cru on the left bank that takes in around twenty hectares. The wine is delicate and precise with truly delightful floral aromatics reminiscent of white flowers and honeysuckle, an exciting prospect, and a real treat.

DOMAINE MOREAU-NAUDET CHABLIS 1er CRU FORETS 2022

Enticing and complex with a presence of oak, certainly a wine to reward some careful cellaring. Delicious weight, bright and very lifted. The fruit here is less forward and the wine is precise and focused, with salinity, sharp acidity and the legs to go the distance. Full of zest and elegance.

DOMAINE MOREAU-NAUDET CHABLIS 1er CRU VAILLONS 2022

A blend of lieux-dits parcels from within the Vaillons site – Sechet, Epinot and Roncier – all on fine Kimmeridgian soils. Very long and complex, big and rich with lemon and pineapple notes alongside a creaminess and evident oak. This wine sees around 18 months élevage, giving balanced weight.

This wine sees less oak than the other 1ers Crus – only about 10% where the others average around 30% - and the result is a broad and mineral wine with an exotic fruit character full of pineapple, and fresh citrus – oranges and lemons. A remarkable salinity to this cuvee lends the wine complexity.

A very well-rounded wine with a delicate hint of honey on the nose, alongside white flowers and grapefruit pith. The wine is lovely and bright with a long, long finish. Structured and firm with hints of cardamom and pepper spice. Overall deliciously complex and will reward extended cellaring.

With a lovely dense and broad nose this wine is creamy, structured and expressive. Apricots jump out on the nose and the palate is round, unctuous and balanced with fine acidity – and with great length. An excellent expression of Chablis Grand Cru and a wine that will cellar very rewardingly.

❖ 2 - CÔTE DE NUITS ~ VOSNE-ROMANÉE

Intensity of flavour and refinement are apt descriptors for the wines produced in this world-renowned village. With 233 hectares of vines, of which more than half are either *grand cru* or *premier cru*, the commune and its adjacent neighbour Flagey-Echézeaux, comprise no less than eight *grands crus* (La Grande Rue, Richebourg, La Romanée, La Romanée Conti, Romanée Saint-Vivant, La Tâche, Echézeaux, Les Grands Echézeaux) and a string of some exceptional *premiers crus* (including Aux Brûlées, Cros Parentoux, Les Gaudichots, Aux Malconsorts, Les Petits Monts, Les Suchots).



A relatively new Domaine founded by Sophie Noëllat and Arnaud Sirugue, the children of two famous winemaking families in the village, who we have been working with since the very beginning. In their first year just two wines were made, a Rosé and a Vosne-Romanée village from a plot next to the premiers crus Cros Parantoux and Les Petits Monts, and the quality and skill were already extremely apparent. In 2018 they added a lovely Gevrey-Chambertin and a Meursault Grand Charrons which we are delighted to be able to offer again this year. From next year after Arnaud's parents retire they will also be taking on all of the wines from Domaine Sirugue so watch this space for some interesting new wines that will be making their way into our portfolio from 2025. These are fantastic wines by rising stars in the area so get your hands on what you can while you can. Everything already sells out extremely quickly each year!



DOMAINE ARNAUD et SOPHIE BOURGOGNE PASSE-TOUT-GRAIN ROSÉ 2022

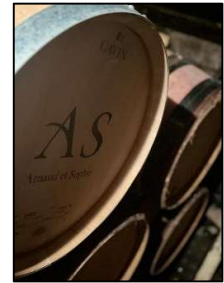

❖ 3 - CÔTE de NUITS ~ NUITS-SAINT-GEORGES

Southernmost commune of the Côte de Nuits, Nuits annexed the name of its most famous *premier cru*, Les Saint-Georges, in 1892. There are indeed no *grand cru* in Nuits-Saint-Georges but Les Saint-Georges is a candidate for promotion to *grand cru* status. Among the 330 hectares of vines, some exceptional Nuits-Saint-Georges *premiers crus* include Aux Boudots, Les Cailles and Les Vaucrains.



❖ 3.1 - Domaine Henri Gouges




Run by cousins Gregory and Antoine, the Domaine was originally founded by Henri Gouges in 1920. We are proud to have been working with the winery since the late fifties when the wines were shipped to us in barrel and bottled in our old offices. Gouges were amongst the first in Burgundy (along with D'Angerville) to push for their wines to be bottled at the winery to avoid bottle variation and we've imported direct from them ever since with rarely a complaint. The estate covers 14 hectares of vines, exclusively in Nuits St Georges, and the volume of production is dictated by climate conditions from vintage to vintage. The growing method focuses on quality and respect of the terroirs at the expense of the quantity.

Their wines are traditionally dense, powerful, and structured; clearly designed to age for the long term, beautifully we should add. The must is vinified in concrete tanks and new oak is lightly used for the élevage which is usually an 18-month affair.

❖ 3.2 - Domaine Thibault Liger-Belair

Certified Organic and Biodynamic Practices in Use

In 2001, Thibault, cousin of Vicomte Liger Belair, took over an old family estate in Nuits-St-Georges and the historic vineyards attached to it: 7.25 hectares across eight AOCs, including Richebourg Grand Cru, Vosne-Romanée 1er Cru "Les Petits-Monts", Vosne-Romanée "Aux Réas", Clos Vougeot Grand Cru and Nuits-St-Georges 1er Cru "Les Saint Georges". Thibault now also has 14 hectares in Moulin-à-Vent, spread across some of the finest sites in the appellation. (See our Beaujolais section for his wines from Moulin-à-Vent.)

The vines are farmed biodynamically with the help of horses to plough the soils. Working in their new winery since May 2018, the team carefully sorts the grapes on a sorting table. Little punching down or pumping during maturation. The wines offer beautiful plump fruit with a mineral vein running through.

❖ 4 - CÔTE de BEAUNE ~ PERNAND-VERGELESSES

Pernand-Vergelesses is tucked into the junction of two valleys among the hills of the Côte de Beaune. The nearby Hill of Corton stands guard over it and two other villages, Aloxe-Corton and Ladoix-Serrigny, harboring prestigious Grands Crus: Corton in red and Corton-Charlemagne in white. Pernand with its sloping site and steep streets has a smiling face. This village makes great red and white wines and has benefited of the hotter vintages of the last 10 years.



A relative newcomer to our portfolio, we are delighted to bring in this exciting range of wines from rising star Jean-Baptiste Boudier. Hidden behind the famous hill of Corton, Boudier is based in the attractive commune of Pernand-Vergelesses – home to an array of terrific producers, until more recently often overshadowed by the more well-trodden appellations to the north and south.

Besides being a prolific student of oenology, having attained qualifications from Beaune, Dijon and Bordeaux, Jean-Baptiste also has a wealth of experience having participated in vintages from Saint-Emilion to New Zealand, and having spent time honing his craft with highly notable producers such as Vieux Telegraphe in Chateauneuf-du-Pape, and Roussillon's Domaine Gauby.

Having also worked alongside his father in Beaune until 2014, Jean-Baptiste branched out in order to pursue his own philosophy and his first harvest came from just three hectares in 2015. This holding has now swollen to more than 6.5 hectares, and now takes in a total of eleven appellations across several small plots, all treated with highly personalised and individual care.

The philosophy is very much one of care and respect for terroir, with each fragment picked and vinified individually, climat names on all labels, and although not certified, organic principles are in practice. Careful handling and delicate extraction, the use of stainless steel, and experimentation with whole bunches is all resulting in lifted, fresh and highly distinctive bottlings across the range, red and white, for which demand is progressively increasing.

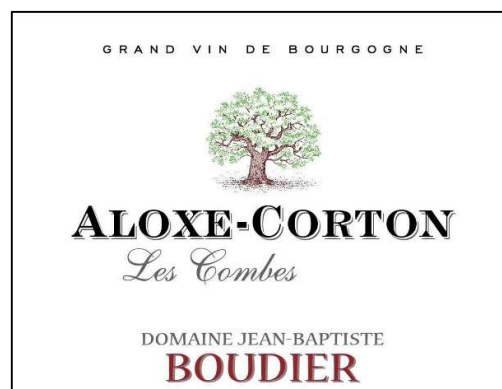

❖ 5 - CÔTE de BEAUNE ~ SAVIGNY-LES-BEAUNE

Carved above a doorway in the village is the motto “*les vins de Savigny sont des vins nourrissants, théologiques et morbifuges*” – nourishing, theological and disease-repelling, such are the wines of Savigny-Les-Beaune – at least that is what was believed in the 17th Century. Savigny-les-Beaune wines from capable producers represent truly excellent value, especially the *premiers crus*, and are well worth exploration. A traditionally red wine village, the trend at the moment is more Chardonnay going into the ground so it will be fascinating to see how the white wines of this village progress.



❖ 5.1 - Domaine Simon Bize

Organic and Biodynamic Practices in Use


Chisa Bize has been at the helm of this very well-regarded 20+ hectare domaine in Savigny since 2013, since the unexpected and tragic passing of her husband, Patrick – the son of a Simon Bize who was himself the son of the original Simon Bize who founded this estate in 1890. The entire team here continue to pursue the domaine's historic and ever-present goal of making wines that are characterful and truly representative of each individual terroir, working in harmony with nature, with as little intervention as possible. Chisa continues to work towards full biodynamic practices.

For the red wines, today they tend to work with 100% whole clusters, and with little oak influence throughout the portfolio – and with just a little oak in use for the maturation of the white wines.




SIMON BIZE SAVIGNY-LES-BEAUNE BLANC 2022

Blended from across several different village appellation parcels, each lending a unique quality, this Savigny white boasts freshly picked citrus fruit, ripe red apples and waves of mineral salinity on top a soft body which is well cut by fresh acidity.

❖ 6 - CÔTE DE BEAUNE ~ POMMARD

Pommard AOC is a 100% red wine appellation for wines produced in the commune of Pommard, which neighbours Volnay in the Côte de Beaune. There are no *grands crus* vineyards within Pommard, but several very highly regarded *premier cru* vineyards such as Les Rugiens and Les Epenots which have been on the radar for elevation for some time. The AOC was created in 1937, and Pommard wines have traditionally been among the most powerful and tannic of the Côte de Beaune wines, although with a rapidly changing climate they are becoming much more accessible in their youth.



Domaine de Courcel is over four hundred years old, with lineage dating back to the 17th Century, and is currently owned and operated by Gilles de Courcel and his three sisters who are direct descendants of the founders. The wines are made by Yves Confuron from Domaine Confuron-Cotedidot in Vosne-Romanée so you can expect some similarities in style there – later picks and heavier extraction techniques offering up wines that are firmly structured and show their true potential with age, turning their dense concentration into layers of complex flavours and aromas over time.

The estate owns one of the largest holdings of Pommard *premiers crus*, covering Le Grand Clos des Epenots, Les Rugiens, Les Frémiers and Les Croix Noires – a grand and well-respected domaine.



DOMAINE de COURCEL BOURGOGNE ROUGE 2022

A concentrated Bourgogne Rouge from low-yielding old vines that fills the glass in a Pommard fashion and offers up quality more in line with a premier cru or lieux-dit bottling. Rich and elegant with a full body, plenty of red and black fruit, mouth-filling tannins and a dash of trademark spice.

❖ 7 - CÔTE DE BEAUNE ~ MEURSAULT

For a long time the idea of Meursault was linked to one style of wine only, often summed up in two words: buttery, and nutty. Was Meursault a one-trick pony? If it ever was true, it certainly isn't anymore. With the advance of more and more single vineyard bottlings, Meursault has become a diverse and fascinating appellation. There is no Grand Cru in Meursault but seventeen premiers crus of which Les Charmes, Les Genevrières and Les Perrières are often praised for their exceptional quality. With Meursault, however, you don't need to stick to premier cru bottlings to drink high quality – the village wines are very fine across the board, and it is the village-level lieux-dits such as Tillets, Gruyaches and Les Grands Charrons that are today offering up so much diversity.



Domaine Jean Boillot was first created in 1885 and is now run by the fifth and sixth generations of the Boillot family, Henri Boillot and his son Guillaume. Henri bought out his brother's and sister's shares in 2005 and applied his own name to the domaine, and today he makes the production of white wines his focus. His son Guillaume takes care of the reds as well as heading up the viticultural operation and will slowly take over entirely over the next few years. In 1995, Henri created a negociant arm, *Maison Henri Boillot*, and extended his range of appellations whilst dedicating himself to buying grapes only from the very best growers. It goes without saying that Henri would never jeopardise the image of this stellar domaine and the negociant wines are therefore subject to the same care and attention to detail. Ensuring there is no difference in quality between the two. This is a strength and commitment that propelled Henri Boillot to be considered as one of the most talented winemakers of his generation.

All of the wines are made in the same state-of-the-art winery in Meursault, built in 2005, and in the vineyards chemical pesticides and herbicides are avoided. The whites are pure and crisp and where oak is used it is used judiciously, and the reds tend to be deeply coloured without being over extracted, and very sensual in character, showing off the identity of each terroir with remarkable clarity. Henri is clear that there is never any battonage used ever! These wines are incredibly popular and availability is limited across the range – please apply early if you would like to be considered for an allocation from this in-demand vintage.

The Javillier family, originating from Meursault many centuries ago, have always owned vineyards. Armed with an oenology degree from the University of Burgundy in Dijon, Patrick joined the Domaine in 1974. The Domaine has since expanded through a series of acquisitions in the 1980s and 1990s in various appellations, such as Meursault, Puligny-Montrachet, Pommard and Corton-Charlemagne.

The wines of each vineyard and parcel are vinified separately in order to preserve the intrinsic characteristics of each terroir. For the whites, the must undergoes oak barrel fermentation, the amount of new oak being determined according to the provenance of the grapes. Patrick favours long maturing on the lees and, after 17 to 18 months, the wines are bottled with minimum fining and filtration. The Domaine is now run by Marion Javillier and her winemaker brother-in-law Pierre-Emmanuel Lamy.

❖ 8 - CÔTE de BEAUNE ~ PULIGNY-MONTRACHET

Puligny-Montrachet has about 235 hectares of vines, including 100 hectares of premiers crus and 21 of grands crus. Of the latter, Montrachet itself and Bâtard-Montrachet are shared with Chassagne but Puligny can boast sole 'possession' of Bienvenues-Bâtard-Montrachet and Chevalier-Montrachet. Interestingly the village was originally called just Puligny until 1879, when the Montrachet section was added in homage to its iconic Grand Cru vineyard.

Some exceptional premiers crus include Les Combettes, Les Demoiselles, Les Folatières and Les Pucelles. The best Puligny wines combine a beautiful, complex floral bouquet with a steely backbone.



Sylvain Bzikot's grandfather was a Polish emigrant who arrived in Puligny just before the second world war with nothing but the clothes on his back. From those very humble beginnings this family domaine has managed to acquire an impressive 4 hectares of some of the most valuable agricultural land in the world, namely in and around Puligny-Montrachet and various Puligny-Montrachet 1ers Crus. They also own a further 9 hectares of regional appellations producing bottlings such as Bourgogne Blanc, Aligoté and Côte d'Or Rouge. These are amazingly good value wines and you'd be hard pressed to find many other wines from the area at these prices in 2024.



DOMAINE SYLVAIN BZIKOT BOURGOGNE ALIGOTÉ 2022

Bottled at the beginning of July 2023. A very crisp nose lifted and fresh, and a good basket of fruit here – apple, pear and a hint of peach. Nice minerality and a round body to the wine too. Acidity high but not aggressive, and a lingering saline kick on the end palate.

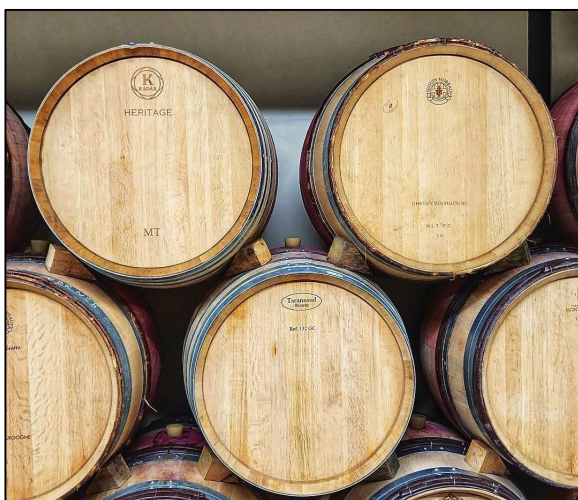

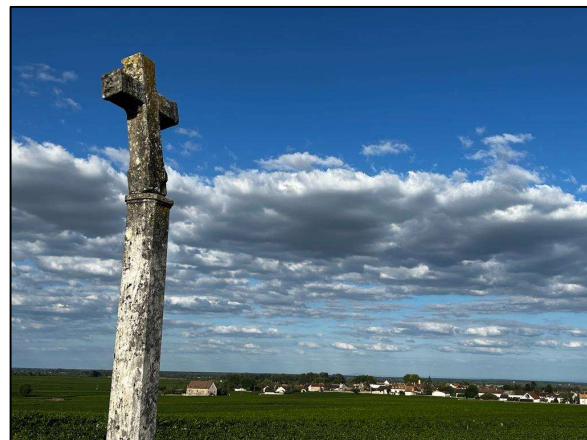

Now working from a total of ten small parcels across three hectares, there is plenty of time for individual attention in the fields and the winery, with sustainability and organic principles guiding the process at all times. Exquisite wines emerging from famous premiers crus such as Les Folatieres and Les Perrières, with guided intensity in balance with fresh minerality.

❖ 9 - CÔTE de BEAUNE ~ CHASSAGNE-MONTRACHET

Chassagne annexed the name of its most famous *grand cru* in 1879. Its vineyards surface is 100 hectares larger than its neighbour's, Puligny-Montrachet, and both villages share the *grands crus* Bâtard-Montrachet, Criots-Bâtard-Montrachet and Montrachet. A particularity of Chassagne is that most of its soils are better suited to red grape varieties but the village owes its reputation to its white wines. In the mid-1970s, about $\frac{2}{3}$ of Chassagne's production was red. Nowadays, it's the exact opposite with about $\frac{2}{3}$ white wine production.




The history of this domaine can be traced back to 1857, and over the years the family of Georges Lochardet acquired significant, prime vineyards in some of Burgundy's most coveted terroirs, totalling more than twenty hectares. For many years the winery sold its wines to Maison Drouhin, who also took care of the vineyards for the family. In 2011, after finishing his studies, Armand Lochardet's grandson (also named Armand) took charge of the estate and under his youthful steer the domaine has slowly been converting back to the domaine's singular control, parcel by parcel, with Armand's first commercial wine released under the domaine name in 2013. This is now our fifth vintage importing Armand's wines, and we are lucky to have such a wide variety of wines from this great domaine which is really pushing the boundaries of how wines are being made in Burgundy, with a holistic philosophy and approach to regenerative viticulture that is Armand's trademark. 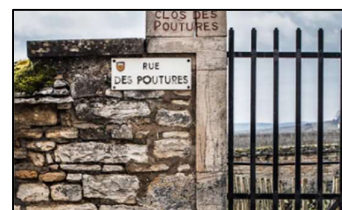

Located in the heart of the Chalonnaise, Mercurey is perhaps the most well-regarded commune of this sub-region, which was formerly known as the 'Région de Mercurey' such is its significance! The vines here grow at elevations of two to three hundred metres on marl and limestone soils - there are no *grands crus* vineyards but 170+ hectares of *premiers crus* mostly for red wines, on protected, south-facing slopes aptly named the 'Croissant d'Or' (the golden crescent). The reds tend to be rich and full-bodied, and the whites more delicate than their sub-regional counterparts.



❖ 10.1 - Domaine Tupinier-Bautista

Lutte Raisonnée - Certified Organic


This family have been producing fine wines on the Mercurey slopes since 1770 in the small hamlet of Touches, at the foot of the Saint-Symphorien church. It was in 1997 that Manu Bautista succeeded his stepfather to the estate and whilst preserving the savoir-faire of previous generations, this transfer brought modernity to an estate now covering eleven hectares of vines. The addition of a brand new, state-of-the-art winery in 2016 was welcome and the wines today exude quality, character and an approachability that makes these truly fun wines above all, ideal for all occasions.

Combined with incomparable hospitality, the estate includes a swimming pool as well as a tasting room, these wines are all about quality and tradition in perfect balance with enjoyment and pure pleasure.

❖ 11 - MÂCONNAIS

It's a very exciting time to be making wine in – and drinking wine from – the Mâconnais region, south of the Chalonnaise and the southernmost sub-region of Burgundy proper, before reaching Beaujolais. Quality here just keeps on rising year after year as Côte d'Or prices continue to spike and discerning drinkers start to look further afield for the best possible alternatives. The elevation of a number of Pouilly-Fuissé plots to premiers crus from the 2020 vintage is the perfect testament to that uptick in status, and more and more producers are attracting attention and finding their wines in high demand. Warmer vintages are bringing more richness and concentration to the wines, so more oak use and winemaking techniques that lend complexity are being deployed, and with the development and implementation of careful vineyard management techniques that ensure fruit still has plenty of bracing acidity and freshness at harvest, the wines being produced are becoming more luxurious and balanced, and offering an increasingly attractive counterpoint to the wines from further north.



Owned by Richard and Stéphane Martin from Domaine de la Croix Senaillet, the Domaine is planted exclusively with Chardonnay on 15 hectares of clay-limestone soils. The vines and the winery are both located in the commune of Clessé. The two brothers have recently added four new cuvées to their range: Mâcon-Péronne, L'Etoile, Viré-Clessé and Breillonde.

❖ 11.2 - Domaine du Talmard Mallory & Benjamin

The Talmard family have been involved in winemaking since the 17th century at their estate based in Uchizy. Today Mallory and Benjamin Talmard operate the family business across 31 hectares, planted uniquely with Chardonnay, some of which was planted by Mallory's grandfather, Joseph Talmard.

Joseph's son Paul led the following generation and used to sell grapes to the local co-operative but in 1971 he decided to produce wine under his own domaine name and Cave Talmard was officially launched in 1973. In 1997 Mallory and Benjamin took over the estate, following in the footsteps of the previous generation in creating wines which would become an absolute benchmark for the area. Fermented entirely in tank, they believe that the combination of the rich, clayey soil, interspersed with mineral deposits produces a wine of such interesting, pure fruit flavours that any wood ageing would only serve to mar it.

Domaine de la Croix Senaillet is located in Davayé, a little village near the famous prehistoric site of Solutré. Certified organic since 2010, the domaine works without synthetic pesticides or chemical fertilisers. The 25 hectares of Chardonnay extend over almost 60 different plots. Most of these plots face the rising sun, on gentle slopes that extend from the eastern hillsides of Solutré and Vergisson.

❖ 12 - BEAUJOLAIS

To the south of the Mâconnais the landscape opens up a little further and we enter the Beaujolais, part of the same administrative region as Burgundy, and these days with certainly more and more overlap in terms of viticultural ethos and wine production techniques. In the northern section, the landscape is much rockier with plenty of granite and schist – and variations thereof – and here is the home of the ten increasingly well-known ‘crus’ including Fleurie, Moulin-a-Vent and Saint-Amour, each producing unique expressions of the Gamay grape variety from distinctive individual terroirs. To the south, hundreds of hectares of clay and sand soils produce easy-going and simply delicious Beaujolais Villages and other regional wines. The quality of these wines, and the diversity of wines on offer, has never been better and these bottles are well worth exploring.



This Beaujolais domaine was founded in 2014 by siblings Lucie and Marc-Antonin – of *Domaine Marc-Antonin Blain* in Chassagne-Montrachet, where these wines are vinified.

They have fourteen acres of old vines here, all of which are at least fifty years old and are located on the slopes of the ancient volcano of Mont Brouilly. The ethos is very much of everything being done by hand, slowly and with great care and attention, in order to achieve the best possible expressions of terroir from these unique and coveted granite soils.

On offer this year we have two cuvées – the domaine's Brouilly AOC bottling from the soils towards the foot of Mont Brouilly, where deeper sand and clay soils on top of the granite bedrock yield fruity, fresh and charming wines – and also a Côtes de Brouilly AOC bottling from the top of the slope, where shallow soils of crumbly blue granite yield wines with increased intensity, a mineral core, and a savoury side to their character.

The siblings are also currently undergoing a ten-year project of replanting to modernise the vineyard layouts and ultimately pursue organic certification.



BLAIN SŒUR et FRÈRE BROUILLY 2022

An energetic, fruity Brouilly with a round texture and great depth for the category – a perfect all-rounder and a delicious crowd-pleaser. 100% whole bunch.

Jean-Paul Brun works his 39-hectare domaine in Charnay, a village just north of Lyon, very much in the Burgundian fashion rather than the semi-carbonic winemaking that this region has historically been associated with.

The must is fermented with natural yeasts and Jean-Paul employs very low levels of sulphur in his wines to preserve the intensity and purity of the fruit.

Jean-Paul has also been highly instrumental in the region for revolutionising the approach to winemaking throughout the region - and is famous for his low intervention style and use of indigenous yeasts and dismissing the practices of carbonic maceration and chaptalisation.

There is a natural verve to his approach which works perfectly for producing pure, earthy and expressive wines, and with the Burgundian approach in use they are truly masterful expressions of each respective terroir he bottles.

Organic & Biodynamic Practices In Use

Thibault Liger-Belair, whose wines we all know and love from his domaine located in Nuits-Saint-Georges, has another popular project located in the Beaujolais cru of Moulin-a-Vent – Domaine des Pierres Roses – an estate now well known for producing big, structured and characterful wines very well suited to stowing away in the cellar, such is the quality and complexity on offer.

Thibault studied for a while in Belleville, Beaujolais, and there he became fascinated with the beauty of the region and the quality and diversity of its soils. He decided to create a Burgundian model here by isolating each terroir within the same appellation in order to try to truly understand it and then make the most of its identity. He says that there are many similarities with the Burgundy model, in terms of the vines and the unique micro-climates found here, as well as with regard to winemaking methods and élevage, not to mention that historically the wines of the Beaujolais are the cousins of Burgundy.

The first plots were bought in 2008, in order for them to produce the first vintage in 2009, and since then Thibault has reproduced all the same methods as those in Nuits-Saint-Georges by reintroducing ploughing and removing all chemicals. He has also employed organic and biodynamic cultivation principles here since the very first vintage.



DOMAINE des PIERRES ROSES MOULIN-A-VENT LES VIEILLES VIGNES 2022

The flagship wine of this estate, this old vine label is a blend made with fruit from nine different and diverse parcels from across the cru, with some of the oldest vines well over one hundred years old, planted as far back as 1910! This is a dense and firm expression of Moulin-a-Vent, deeply coloured and full of plum fruit and spice with a vibrant structure.

Organic & Biodynamic Practices In Use

Highly attached to his own region of the Côte de Beaune, and the village of Chassagne-Montrachet – but in love with French wine heritage above all – Armand Heitz set out in 2018 to conquer Beaujolais and established this joint venture with his brother-in-law Augustin.

The domaine known as la Combe Vineuse is composed of six hectares of land in the cru of Julié纳斯. Characterful and structured, and like many modern producers in this region, they are subverting the long-standing stereotype of Beaujolais as a region just for simple and fruity wines.

The wines have a focused freshness with finely balanced acidity and strong identities of terroir, displaying complexity and great length.



DOMAINE de LA COMBE VINEUSE JULIÉNAS 2022

From vineyard sites located on shale, clay and blue rocks – similar terroir to that of Morgon’s famous Côtes de Py – this is a terrific expression of Julié纳斯 from a top producer. Rich and bright violets and berry fruit with blackberries and plum, a lifted herbal edge, and firm dry tannins. Very fine and elegant cru Beaujolais and a great example of what is possible here.

This is an “en primeur” offer. All prices are IN BOND (‘IB’) so exclude Duty & VAT. Prices are per case of 6 bottles/ 12 bottles/3 or 6 magnums unless stated otherwise (E&OE).

We ask our growers to ship the case sizes that we requested for the offer, however sometimes we receive different case sizes, so we may have to split the cases. This is generally when we receive cases of 12 bottles instead of 6 as requested.

The allocation process will take place from Wednesday, 24th of January 2024 until Monday, 12th February 2024. We will start allocations early however, so please make sure to put in your requests earlier rather than later. If there are wines remaining after the allocation process has been completed, we will keep the pricing valid for any subsequent orders until the 17th of March 2022. All wines are offered subject to remaining unsold. As usual we will do our best to satisfy all requests, but we may have to come back to you with alternative suggestions.

Please note that we give priority to customers who support us every year and across the board.

The in-bond price excludes UK duty and VAT (currently 20%). When the wines are shipped (anytime until April 2024 for certain red wines), we will ask you for your storage/delivery instructions. If you want us to deliver, we will then issue an invoice for the duty, and VAT on both the original invoice value of the wines and the duty (yes, we do pay tax on tax!).

We also reserve the right to charge for onward delivery on any single delivery of less than 24 bottles (mixed) at the rate of £18.00 incl. VAT per delivery. Delivery charges to Scotland (north of Glasgow/Edinburgh) + Highlands and Islands will be passed on at cost (please enquire). Deliveries to Northern Ireland may be subject to further inspection/duty charges at point of delivery.

If you want us to store the wine for you in bond, we will transfer it to our customers’ paid reserves section at London City Bond in Dinton Storage charges are currently £9.60+VAT per dozen or £4.80+VAT per 6 bottle case (or smaller) per year or part thereof, to include insurance at full replacement value (subject to normal conditions). Please note, we reserve the right to review storage charges. As our storage facility is bonded, you will not be charged duty and VAT on your purchases until you withdraw them for drinking, at the rates then prevailing.
