Welcome to our 2020 Burgundy En Primeur offer. First of all, many thanks for your support over the past 12 months which has been challenging for us all. Without it we would not be here.

We were fortunate to be able to visit our growers and to taste their wines over a fortnight at the end of 2021. It felt great to finally catch up in person and to taste with them.

On another positive note, 2020 is a great vintage for both colours but especially for the whites which are more homogeneous. Volumes are good for the white wines but sadly the 2021 frost counteracts these benefits. There is less volume for the reds (excluding Beaujolais) due to a lack of water during the growing season. Prices have risen for the reasons mentioned and the extra cost of dry goods, however the wines are of a very high quality and are not to be missed.

We had to cancel our EP tasting due to the uncertainty and high cases of Omicron but we are planning to ship over a few of these wines for our Tasting on Monday the 7<sup>th</sup> of March 2022 so we can finally share a few glasses with you all again.

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## **A year like no other**

In the long and varied history of Burgundy perhaps there has never been a vintage quite like 2020, an exceptional and unexpected year. Not just from a wine making perspective, but also notable because of the worldwide pandemic which cast its dark shadow over the 2020 harvest and will forever be impressed in the minds of all winemakers. Nature marches forth, wreaking havoc on the one hand, and on the other creating solid conditions for the vigneron of Burgundy to craft another excellent vintage to savour in the (hopefully) more positive years to come. It was, in all evidence, a year of exceptional white wines with an abundance of lifted energy and reflection of terroir. A more variable plateau arrived in the reds which manage in many places to reach the ethereal, and always express a serious tension, concentration and lifted vibrancy with more than just a vague hint cutting through of their long-term ageing potential in the cellar. Being one of the warmest, driest, and earliest vintages on record in the last 20 years, it is remarkable that this vintage does not suffer from overbearing opulence or an overtly high alcohol experience in the glass, but instead seems to deliver an exceptionally lifted, fresh and vibrant personality in the glass.

## **The Season defined: hot, dry and early**

Following on from the notably difficult but ultimately highly rewarding 2019 vintage the vigneron and vigneronnes of Burgundy saw the new season begin with a relatively mild winter as 2019 ended, with vines achieving full dormancy as usual and certainly no apparent risk of any deep winter freeze.

The vines slept serenely, and the sub-soils enjoyed what seemed to be a more than adequate rainfall to see them through the season ahead. The late winter saw more of the same, with sufficient rainfall and suitably cold conditions. However, spring launched itself with a flourish of unseasonably warm and dry weather that awoke the vineyards early – worryingly early for many, as buds burst weeks early, and the first shoots began to emerge long before the frost risk had passed. Fortunately, frost issues were fairly isolated, and growers could breathe in relief as the mild and dry conditions sustained themselves.

All felt very different in the vineyards though as the pandemic progressed, with social distancing measures enforced throughout the Domaines. The ever-improving air quality and daily decreasing air and sound pollution were both positives brought with the pandemic response as nature reclaimed the land. Planes no longer set their contrails through the skies as the harvest progressed down below.

The vines enjoyed a clear run all the way to flowering, again several weeks early with many vineyards in full bloom by the end of May. A little rain served to top up the underfoot reserves whilst gentle winds and warm conditions continued for long enough to allow successful pollination in all regions, again allowing a clear path to fruit set. Yield forecasts began to appear healthy. June then brought with it some grey days and fluctuating temperatures that raised a few questions.

Intense heat and sunshine followed throughout July and August, with the Dijon weather station reporting a fifty per cent drop in rainfall over the mid-summer period, accompanied by a very high increase in sunshine hours (around 27% overall). This created a welcome reduction in disease pressure in the fields but as the days wore on some vines, especially in Beaune, showed excessive green growth, followed by symptoms of drought and on occasion the developing fruit had to be shielded from the risk of sunburn.

**Gregory at Domaine Henri Gouges explained** to us that it was a very hot and especially dry harvest for them. They often work with grasses in between the vines as this helps biodiversity in the vineyard, however they had to lose the grass in 2020 due to the excessive dry weather in this period. Everything was fighting for the water supplies below, and they needed to focus the limited supply for the growing vines.

Following the early bud burst and growth, the vines' passage was slowed a little by the June clouds also and the threat of mid-summer hydric stress, but regardless of this, the time for harvest arrived weeks early with many of our producers out picking in the fields from mid- to late August, and some even close to finishing by month's end. Indeed, it was one of the earliest harvests on record overall for Burgundy. It quickly became apparent that although yields were modest there was some exceptional fruit on offer to work with – concentrated with flavour from the sunshine and lack of rain, and full of animated acidity that will certainly drive their freshness for years to come, providing tension and lots of future ageing potential in the bottle.

### **And the scores are...**

2020 seems to be an exceptional year for Chardonnay in particular, full of intense and powerful fruit and bright acids that will seal their longevity in the cellar, but certainly not lacking the trademark minerality and flora that provide testimony for each terroir. High levels of tartaric acid add a welcome, crisp edge to the character of the white wines, and offer a lifted freshness with plenty of zest – with less malolactic influence than usual to soften the corners. With such an uplift in sunlight and heat overall you would also expect far more weight in body for the whites, with flavour veering more into the tropical, but this is actually presenting itself as a lean and focused vintage, which nods a little towards the 2017 whites as a recent comparison. The yield, lying respectably somewhere between the harvest levels of 2019 and 2018, leaves room for manoeuvre to producers and gives the opportunity to purchase some wines for the cellar ahead of the drought of availability that will no doubt affect the whole world for the 2021 EP releases next year. It is a time to shore up any allocations, not dither in the details too much.

Pinot Noir, an awkward customer at the best of times, of course protested at times at the intense heat, but is showing a return to its distinctive nuance following the two ripe and forward vintages that have preceded this one. There is great vibrancy, lifted freshness, and concentration to the 2020 reds with a much lower pH level overall. The lower pH lends both freshness and perfectly comfortable conditions for an extended period of bottle development. Remarkable really to see these elements as vintage defining characteristics considering the extreme heat conditions of the summer period and the earlier than normal harvest time (obviously a defining factor in retaining the vibrancy of the grapes). There are some comparisons that can be drawn for the reds with the difficult 2016 vintage, and we expect, like that vintage, that the reds will fully harmonise after some time spent in bottle to reveal further ethereal and hidden qualities in due course. Bruno Clavelier says of the wines: "The vintage is remarkable both for its precocity and for its quality. The wines are rich and concentrated with record levels of polyphenols. The touch on the palate reveals silky textures, the lingers are long, tasty and the finish remains fresh. Despite the heat of the vintage, the balances are extraordinarily preserved". Alcohol levels in the 2020s are on average 0.5% to 1% lower than the previous two vintages, being a sign of both reduced body volume and sugar levels that are evidently present in the fresher and more acidity driven wines of 2020.

### **Chablis riding high and casting the net further**

Chablis has once again delivered a classic vintage of wines which have managed to retain exceptional poise, shell-like minerality and lifted freshness despite the challenges with frost presented at the beginning of the season and the extreme heats throughout the mid to late summer period. There is much lifted character to the wines that we were lucky enough to sample in December last year to allay any fears of an overly exotic Chablis expression in the 2020s. All evidently tropical elements are kept well in check by a coursing vibrancy and lean mineral backbone. Romain Collet of Domaine Collet says that he is very happy with the 2020 vintage, finding the wines overall far fresher and with more crisp acidity across the board. He had some issues with frost which initially caused him concern however this luckily worked out fine overall with limited impact. He started the harvest at midnight on 27<sup>th</sup> August, a practice he began back in 2018 to negate the negative effects of harvesting in the rising heat of the day, in picking whilst the

grapes are still cool: better for the vines and transportation of the grapes at this crucial moment in the harvest. The technique has worked fantastically in 2020 as the wines have a distinct classy and refreshing poise in the glass and this is just one example of how the producers are adapting to the warmer conditions year on year. Many producers have already highlighted the run-on sales they have had in recent months as importers race to secure stocks for future droughts of availability. There is some volume in the 2020 Chablis, however allocations will undoubtedly be less overall for the trade and collectors alike as the industry realigns itself to the new normal and many wine makers may hold back wines from the 2020 harvest to bump up volumes next year, which is something to be considered.

Looking between the obvious historically venerated appellations in this vintage will ultimately bare fruit for the more adventurous amongst buyers as well as provide exceptional quality at a more reasonable price point. Casting the net of interest further afield could be a very clever approach.

### **In Conclusion: resilience, great freshness, and energy**

Opening a bottle of 2020 Burgundy will always bring with it a plethora of memories and emotions, personal to all and yet ever evocative of this extraordinary period in our recent history.

Its success, as success is measured by what is in the glass here, is a vinous lighthouse for astounding resilience and what can be achieved under conditions of great fear, isolation, and uncertainty.

We are certain that one positive story to come from the challenges thrown at the vigneron of the Cote D'or and indeed the whole winemaking world through the pandemic will be the lifted refreshing energy and pleasure delivered in glass from the 2020 vintage in Burgundy. Wines which are remarkable for consistent reflection of terroir, intensity of concentration, tension and a long-term ageing potential for the cellar and patient enthusiast alike.



## CHABLIS

Chablis is the far Northern outpost of Burgundy. Located some 160 km north of the Côte d'Or, Chablis cultivates its geographical and geological differences with the rest of Burgundy. Its Kimmeridgian clay-and-limestone soils, rich with marine fossils, and its marginal climate, are key to the flinty, mineral character for which Chablis is famous.

### Domaine Jean Collet & Fils

*Lutte Raisonnée / Organic*

One of the great multi-generational families of Chablis, the Collet family have been making wine in this region since 1792, and the Domaine itself was established in 1952 by Jean Collet. His grandson, Romain, is now firmly at the helm and has overseen each vintage since returning to Chablis in 2009.

Romain studied winemaking in Beaune and like many of his generation, worked abroad, including in New Zealand. Our congratulations go to him on becoming a father again in 2021 – and our best wishes go to him on his pursuit of opening a brand-new tasting room and venue in the centre of Chablis soon.

The Collet estate comprises 37 hectares of vines with parcels in the Valmur Grand Cru; 1er Crus Montée de Tonnerre, Mont de Milieu, Montmains and Vaillons, plus lieux-dit 'Les Truffières', Chablis and Petit Chablis. The family have tended to their vines historically according to the 'lutte raisonnée' principles which limit the usage of phytosanitary treatments to the absolute minimum necessary, and they have now successfully converted several of their vineyards to fully certified organic viticulture.

Their 2020 harvest started early, at midnight on the 27th August – a practice used by Romain since 2018. An army of forty pickers descend on the vineyards overnight and hand-pick the fruit at the coolest possible temperatures, preserving delicate aromatics and the region's trademark, razor-like acidity – concluding the pick at 11am the next morning. Significant crop losses have been reported by Romain in 2021 – as indeed they have at many estates – so now is certainly the time to stock up, and 2020 is proving to be a fabulous vintage to do so with.

Lush and rounded with a blue-gold tint in the glass; this has a very satisfying colour. Steely and zippy with a good minerality yet rounded, lush and still delicate. Fresh and lifted with good energy. Citrus fruits are present but it's harder to discern much more at this time of tasting.

The wine has a rich nose of lemon curd, cream, and butter and with a lifted mineral shine. Romain has

limited yield in this smaller cuvée - 1200 bottles a year. This has a good length with a spicy and pithy finish.

A bright, lifted, and steely wine with a good solid acidity, housing a gentle mineral backbone at its core. A playful long length on the finish and a lingering butter finish. Dry pithy notes and stony minerals complement this overall very fresh wine.

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## Domaine Jean Dauvissat Père & Fils

*Organic and Biodynamic practices used – currently in conversion*

Since we first started working with this Domaine in 2013, Fabien Dauvissat has consistently produced excellent, trademark Chablis that offer superb value for money – and there are some very exciting developments right ahead, as this year the wines will be the first issued with wax tops and a new label design, featuring sketches of the Domaine’s vineyards – the finishing touches to which are being applied as we write.

Fabien works everything by hand wherever possible and has also been practicing organic viticulture since 2014. After submitting his application for certified conversion back in 2017, the first fully certified organic vintage from Dauvissat will be 2022. The land has been worked with a biodynamic philosophy since 2019 and the team proudly oversee the expansion of biodiversity within the vineyards, with plantings of herbs and vegetables increasing all the time. Biodynamic certification is also very much on the radar for the near future.

Spread over fifty-three individual parcels of vines that together extend to over twenty-two hectares, this is a sprawling estate that produces an exquisite array of bottlings. The Domaine’s fruit is carefully sorted and vinified only ever in stainless steel tanks, and the wines are then aged over a relatively long period before bottling. The village level wines are allowed to harmonise for eighteen months prior to release, and the premiers crus for up to two years – to ensure settled, characterful wines with elegance, finesse and a balanced, well-integrated structure of acidity.



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## Domaine Moreau-Naudet

Virginie Moreau and her two young daughters have been at the helm of this twenty-five-hectare Domaine since the summer of 2016, when husband Stéphane tragically suffered a heart attack just two years after opening their new cellar-winery just outside the Golden Gate of Burgundy. Her parents previously ran the village restaurant in Irancy, *Le Soufflot*, and she became a vigneron by trade herself working alongside Stéphane.

Producing some of the most well-regarded wines in the region thanks to delicate handling, prolonged élevage and light filtration – the Moreau-Naudet portfolio spans a broad range of the most sought-after crus of Chablis, including a coveted slice of the Grand Cru plot of Valmur. The premiers crus on offer include Vaillons, Montmains and Les Forêts, and the lieux-dit of Les Pargues offers exceptional value for money, as well as the village wine. After years of deliberation, we have finally decided to switch to the newer labelling, much to the delight of Virginie!

With a remarkably low yield from 2020 by comparison with previous vintages, these wines will be in very high demand this year – particularly with the news that this Domaine was amongst the many that were so sadly hit with devastating conditions in 2021, with yields down up to 70%.

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### CHABLIS

This comes from a 12-hectare parcel of clay and limestone. The wine is gold-green in colour. A rich palate with stem ginger spice, this is a full style of wine. Lush and robust, its citrus fruit bouquet is welcome alongside a very balanced acidity.

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### CHABLIS VV LES PARGUES - LIMITED

The grapes come from 75-year-old vines on a ten hectare parcel.

This wine is incredible value for money. One third aged in old oak

This is a beautiful, delicate style. Visually, the wine has a shimmering light green/gold colour. It is lifted with a vibrant energy, subtle lemon, and citrus fruits. There is a buttery core in the middle returning to lovely long citrus fruits on the finish of cordial concentration. This wine is well structured, serious and classy. **Tasted: December 2021 – DT**



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## CÔTE DE NUITS

### VOSNE-ROMANÉE

Intensity of flavour and refinement are apt descriptors for the wines produced in this world-renowned village. With 233 hectares of vines, of which more than half are either *grand cru* or *premier cru*, the commune and its adjacent neighbour Flagey-Echézeaux, comprise no less than eight *grands crus* (La Grande Rue, Richebourg, La Romanée, La Romanée Conti, Romanée Saint-Vivant, La Tâche, Echezeaux, Les Grands Echezeaux) and a string of some exceptional *premiers crus* (including Aux Brûlées, Cros Parentoux, Les Gaudichots, Aux Malconsorts, Les Petits Monts, Les Suchots).

#### Domaine Arnaud et Sophie

A new Domaine founded by Sophie Noëllat and Arnaud Sirugue. So far only very few wines have been made including in their first year, a Rosé and a lovely Vosne village (a parcel that they rent from Arnaud's parents), from a plot next to the *premiers crus* Cros Parentoux and Les Petits Monts. From the 2018 vintage they released a Gevrey – Chambertin and Meursault Grand Charrons (they buy the grapes from the same growers) which we are delighted to be able to offer again this year. Please note that we are the only UK importer for the wines for the wines of Arnaud and Sophie.

During our visit and tasting with Arnaud, sadly Sophie could not join us. Arnaud said “the 2020 vintage is more homogeneous and better as a whole for his wines than 2019”. And because of this they used less oak in 2020.

The harvest started on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of September.

### Domaine Confuron-Cotetidot

Created in 1964 by Jack Confuron, the Domaine has 13 hectares of vines. The Domaine has a large number of very old vines which are well suited to the recent dry and hot Summers with their long roots. Jack's son Yves has run the Domaine now for the last couple of decades. They do not own a destemmer, so everything here is 100% whole bunch. Their harvest took place from the 24<sup>th</sup> September – Yves likes to pick relatively late which aids in the ripeness of the grapes, particularly relevant with the lack of destemming. These are wines for the long term. As Yves said for the 2020 “there is a huge concentration of flavours, the wines are low acid but very fresh. This vintage is baroque and unique. A hot vintage, but still terroir driven”.

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## Domaine Bruno Clavelier

Biodynamic

The Domaine has been present in Vosne-Romanée since the late 18<sup>th</sup> century. After the tough times of the later 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries (the wars and phylloxera), Bruno's maternal grand-father, Joseph Brosson, developed the Domaine between 1935 and 1955. In 1987, after a career as a rugby player and a degree in oenology, Bruno took over. He is now looking after 6.5 hectares of vines, many of which were planted in the 1930s-1940s.

The harvest started on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of August. Bruno told us that interestingly the "selection massale" vines resisted droughts better than the clones.

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### VOSNE-ROMANÉE LA COMBE BRÛLÉE – LIMITED

88-year-old vines in a cold site, with 50% whole bunch vinification. Similar deep purple. The nose has slightly darker fruit, with the whole bunch showing a touch more, and some black tea notes. ## Domaine Georges Mugneret-Gibourg

Organic practice – not certified

Opening in Vosne-Romanee in 2022 is ‘La Maison de Jacqueline’ – the Mugneret-Gibourg family home, transformed into a bed and breakfast for visitors to the region – and as far as historic and renowned producers go, this domaine will certainly be well worth taking a moment to stop and explore should you find yourself travelling the Route des Grands Crus later this year.

Formed in 1933, following the marriage of Andre Mugneret and Jeanne Gibourg in 1928, this estate is now in the hands of the third generation of winemakers – Marie-Andree and Marie-Christine – the two daughters of the only son of Andre and Jeanne, Georges Mugneret, and his wife Jacqueline after whom the brand new hospitality endeavour is named. The family pattern is also now repeating itself – with both Marie-Andree and Marie-Christine the proud mothers of two daughters apiece, so the estate may well pass from mothers to daughters in the decades to come.

The wines are rich in delicacy, freshness and expression, the result of a rigorous and highly attentive and selective process in both the vineyard and the winery – and after spending eighteen months at the domaine resolving in oak barrels, the best wines can endure for decades. Spanning eight full hectares of land across multiple parcels in nine separate appellations, there is plenty to choose from in terms of diversity of style, with each wine terrifically expressive of each individual terroir – and at an annual production of just 20,000 bottles or so each year, and with a rapidly broadening range of export markets, these wines are in high demand so highly worthy of the close attention they receive each year.

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## NUITS-SAINT-GEORGES

Southernmost commune of the Côte de Nuits, Nuits annexed the name of its most famous *premier cru*, Les Saint-Georges, in 1892. There are indeed no *grand cru* in Nuits-Saint-Georges but Les Saint-Georges is a candidate for promotion to *grand cru* status. Among the 330 hectares of vines, some exceptional Nuits-Saint-Georges *premiers crus* include Aux Boudots, Les Cailles and Les Vaucrains.

### Domaine Henri Gouges

Run by cousins Gregory and Antoine, the Domaine was originally founded by Henri Gouges in 1920. Their wines are traditionally dense, powerful, and structured; clearly designed to age for the long term, beautifully we shall add. Watch out for the whites which are wonderful, and a bit of an oddity as they are made of Pinot Gouges (Pinot Blanc). The must is vinified in concrete tanks and new oak is lightly used for the 'élevage' which is usually an 18-month affair. In 2020, the Domaine managed 17 hl/ha - very small volumes (objective is 35 hl/ha in a normal year). The Domaine works a lot with grass between vines so in 2020 the grass did give the wine a lot of competition for the little water there was hence the smaller yields. Yields are about 25 hl/ha in 2021 which is above average in the area.

The harvest started the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of August.

In 2001, Thibault, cousin of Vicomte Liger Belair, took over an old family estate in Nuits-St-Georges and the historic vineyards attached to it: 7.25 hectares across eight AOCs, including Richebourg Grand Cru, Vosne-Romanée 1er Cru "Les Petits-Monts", Vosne-Romanée "Aux Réas", Clos Vougeot Grand Cru and Nuits-St-Georges 1er Cru "Les Saint Georges". Thibault now also has 14 hectares in Moulin-à-Vent, spread across some of the finest sites in the appellation.

The vines are farmed biodynamically with the help of horses to plough the soils. Working in their new winery since May 2018, the team carefully sorts the grapes on a sorting table. Little punching down or pumping during maturation. The wines offer beautiful plump fruit with a mineral vein running through. Thibault has made some beautiful 2020 wines and we recommend them very highly. Do not forget his Moulin à Vent as these are very special indeed and will be ready to drink earlier than usual and keep for years. The quality/price ratio is hard to compete with.

The company Thibault Liger-Belair Successeurs, created in 2003, had the goal to buy back the part of the estates' wines that belong to the Liger-Belair's family.

"We thought that it was interesting to use this company to vinify other appellations on other plots. This is why we started this business of buying grapes with a very specific objective: to harvest, to vinify and to raise it on my own. We then began to work with the winemakers to go back to cleaner and more soil-friendly farming practices. So, we buy the crops between June and July and we do the last work ourselves. It is not the fact that the vine grower works in a bad way but each of us has his own method of development. We offer the winemaker to buy from him the permitted yield, which makes us free to choose the yield we want between 25 and 35 hl depending on the vintage."

Hidden behind the famous hill of Corton, Boudier is based in the attractive commune of Pernand-Vergelesses – home to an array of terrific producers, until more recently often overshadowed by the more well-trodden appellations to the north and south.

Besides being a prolific student of oenology, having attained qualifications from Beaune, Dijon and Bordeaux, Jean-Baptiste also has a wealth of experience, having participated in vintages from Saint-Emilion to New Zealand, and having spent time honing his craft with highly notable producers such as Vieux Telegraphe in Chateaufort, and Roussillon's Domaine Gauby.

Having also worked alongside his father in Beaune until 2014, Jean-Baptiste branched out in order to pursue his own philosophy and his first harvest came from just three hectares in 2015. This holding has now swollen to 6.5 hectares as of 2021, and now takes in a total of eleven appellations across several small plots, all treated with highly personalised and individual care.

The philosophy is very much one of care and respect for terroir, with each fragment picked and vinified individually, climat names on all labels, and although not certified, organic principles are in practice.

Careful handling and delicate extraction, the use of stainless steel, and experimentation with whole bunches is all resulting in lifted, fresh and highly distinctive bottlings across the range, red and white, for which demand is progressively increasing.

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#### PERNAND-VERGELESSES BLANC

This Pernand-Vergelesses comes from 3 parcels namely Les Vignes Blanches & Les Pins (West facing) and Devant des Cloux (South Facing). The soil here is shallow clay-limestone and marne.

This wine is fresh with an austere nose – a bit hidden to start. A larger and richer mouthfeel follows, giving butter and nutty notes, alongside a high tone anise spice on the end. There is good fruit here too with peach skins and a tart acidity. **Tasted: December 2021 – DT**

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### CORTON-CHARLEMAGNE LE CORTON - LIMITED

Jean Baptiste's Corton-Charlemagne comes from a parcel situated on top of the hill with a South-eastern exposition. 2019 was the first year he harvested the Corton Charlemagne and in these vintages he has made just one barrel of this wine.

It has a rich, perfumed nose with a hint of spice. On the palate it is lush with exotic fruits as well as apricot preserve and a hint of butter. This wine is complex, evolving with each taste – fig roll notes arrived next. With all this complexity, it still manages to stay rounded, balanced and fresh with a helpful salinity on the finish. This is a beautiful and very serious wine. **Tasted: December 2021 – DT**

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### SAVIGNY-LES-BEAUNE ROUGE EZ CONNARDISES

The parcel for this wine is situated next to a river where there used to be ducks hence the name. The terroir here is mixed alluvial (from the river) clay-limestone and calcareous stones giving an interesting make up.

This wine is perfumed on the nose with concentrated berries. It is fresh and lifted with a lovely structure to the mouthfeel. The wine was

tasted in his cellar which was December cold – however notes of smoked bacon, and crunchy red fruits still made themselves known. This is a charming wine, begging to go with food the more it opened up in the glass.

## SAVIGNY-LES-BEAUNE

“*Les vins de Savigny sont des vins nourrissants, théologiques et morbifuges.*” Nourishing, theological and disease-repelling, such are the wines of Savigny-Les-Beaune. At least that’s what was believed in the 17<sup>th</sup> century. Savigny wines are usually fuller bodied than Beaune’s. Many *premiers crus* offer good value.

### Domaine Simon Bize

After the sudden passing away of Patrick Bize five years ago, his wife Chisa is now at the helm of this key 22 hectare Domaine in Savigny, aided by her son Hugo and the new technical director Eric Pignal (from the 2021 vintage). The entire team carry on Patrick’s ever-present goal of making wines representative of their terroirs, by working in harmony with nature and ensure the Domaine’s future in a healthy environment.

For the red wines they tend to work with whole clusters, depending on the appellation and the vintage.

Chisa might release the wines a bit later than expected as she prefers to put on the market wines which are more mature and ready to drink so we will be in touch shortly to see what will be released for the 2020 vintage.

## POMMARD

Pommard wine is produced in the commune of Pommard in Côte de Beaune, Burgundy. The Appellation d'Origine Contrôlée (AOC) Pommard is only used for red wine with Pinot noir as the main grape variety. There are no *grand cru* vineyards within Pommard, but several highly regarded *premier cru* vineyards. The AOC was created in 1937. Pommard wines are typically among the most powerful and tannic of the Côte de Beaune wines, providing a clear contrast to the light and more elegant Volnay wines from the neighbouring village.

### Domaine De Courcel

#### Lutte Raisonnée

Domaine de Courcel is over 400 years old and spreads over 10.5 hectares of vine. Its current owners, three sisters and one brother, are the descendants of the founders. The estate is managed by Anne Bommelaer and Marie de Courcel. The wines are made by Yves Confuron from Domaine Confuron-Cotedidot so expect some similarities there. The wines are structured and show their true potential with age, turning their structure and dense concentration into layers of complex flavours and aromas. The Domaine owns one of the largest holdings of « Pommard Premier Crus », covering Le Grand Clos des Epenots, Les Rugiens, Les Frémiers, Les Croix Noires.

Being unable to visit the Domaine this year, our team put together some information about the provenance of the grapes for the wines we import.

#### BOURGOGNE ROUGE

This Pinot Noir is sourced just outside Pommard on flatter grounds. The vines are 40 years old and produce wine that is close in many characteristics to the Pommard Village, but with riper and more approachable fruit.

## VOLNAY

Are Volnay the best red wines produced in the Côte de Beaune? We'll leave it to you to decide but it's certain that their light touch, delicacy, and intricate elegance make them highly sought-after wines. There is no *grand cru* in Volnay but many *premiers crus*, including, to the South of the village, some exceptional ones, such as Cailleret, Clos des Chênes, Les Santenots du Milieu and Taillepieds.

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### Domaine Christophe Vaudoisey

Lutte Raisonnée

The Vaudoisey family settled in Volnay in 1804. Christophe and his wife Laurence took the reins in 1985, refurbishing his grand-parents' house at the heart of the village. Pierre their son has now joined the Domaine. Hand-picked, the grapes are 100% destemmed for the Pinot Noir. All the wines are matured in oak barrels (up to 30% new oak) for 16 to 18 months for the reds and 12 months for the whites.

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## Domaine Henri Boillot

Domaine Jean Boillot was created in 1885 and is now run by the fifth and sixth generations of the Boillot family. Henri bought up his brothers and sisters share in 2005 and put his own name to his father's domain. He makes the whites while his son Guillaume makes the reds.

The Domaine's wines and the négociant's wines (Maison Henri Boillot was set up in 1996) are all made in the same state-of-the-art winery in Meursault. In the vineyards, chemical pesticides and herbicides are avoided. The whites are pure and crisp and never too oaky. The reds are deeply coloured without being over extracted, showing their precise terroir's identity.

## Domaine Patrick Javillier

The Javillier family, originating from Meursault many centuries ago, have always owned vineyards. Armed with an oenology degree from the University of Burgundy in Dijon, Patrick joined the Domaine in 1974. The Domaine has since expanded through a series of acquisitions in the 1980s and 1990s in various appellations, such as Meursault, Puligny-Montrachet, Pommard and Corton-Charlemagne.

The wines of each vineyard and parcel are vinified separately in order to preserve the intrinsic characteristics of each terroir. For the whites, the must undergoes oak barrel fermentation, the amount of new oak being determined according to the provenance of the grapes. Patrick favours long maturing on the lees and, after 17 to 18 months, the wines are bottled with minimum fining and filtration. The Domaine is now run by Marion Javillier and her winemaker brother-in-law Pierre-Emmanuel Lamy.

The start of the harvest for whites was 23<sup>rd</sup> August – the earliest they have ever harvested. For the reds they started on 20<sup>th</sup>/21<sup>st</sup> August and 2020 is a normal vintage quantity wise for Javillier.

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### BOURGOGNE COTE D'OR CUVÉE DES FORGETS

This wine comes from the Volnay side and will be bottled at the end of January. Currently in tank, on its finings. Pale colour. A light fresh bouquet with attractive fruit. Some plums, some fresh apple, a steady build up in flesh towards the back of the palate, a good balancing acidity, and fine persistence. Of the latter, Montrachet itself and Bâtard-Montrachet are shared with Chassagne but Puligny can boast sole ‘possession’ of Bienvenues-Bâtard-Montrachet and Chevalier-Montrachet. Some exceptional *premiers crus* include Les Combettes, Les Demoiselles, Les Folatières and Les Pucelles. The best Pulignys combine a beautiful floral bouquet with the tension of a steely backbone.

### Domaine Bzikot Père et Fils

#### *Lutte Raisonnée*

Sylvain Bzikot’s grandfather was a Polish emigrant who arrived in Puligny just before the War with nothing but the clothes he stood in. From those very humble beginnings this family Domaine has managed to acquire an impressive 4 hectares of some of the most valuable agricultural land in the world, namely Puligny-Montrachet and Puligny Montrachet 1er Cru. They own a further 9 hectares of “regional appellations” producing Bourgogne Blanc, Aligoté and Pinot Noir. There is a split between Domaine Bzikot Père et Fils and Sylvain Bzikot (SB) the négociant business.

## Domaine Alain Chavy

One of the great families of Cote de Beaune vigneron are the Chavy family, having been based in Puligny-Montrachet for more than two hundred years. Son of the great Gerard Chavy, Alain and brother Jean-Louis split the holdings in 2003 – and now Alain aided by Corentin for the last few years look after 6.5 hectares, mostly located in the Puligny-Montrachet appellation, including a slice of the Chevalier-Montrachet Grand Cru, and famous Puligny premiers crus such as Les Folatieres, Les Pucelles and Champ Gain. Known for their freshness, these whites are not heavy-handed but possess a richness and nuanced complexity that will certainly reward a long stint in the cellar.

Perhaps one of the great unheralded contemporary producers, Jean-Louis Chavy makes elegant Puligny whites in a classic style. His wines have an enticing purity about them, a sense of harmony and limpidity – and he has had a terrific run of vintages, since 2012 he hasn't put a foot wrong in the eyes of most critics. Now working from a total of ten small parcels across three hectares, there is plenty of time for individual attention in the fields and the winery, with sustainability and organic principles guiding the process at all times, and exquisite wines emerging from famous premiers crus such as Les Folatières and Les Perrières, with guided intensity in balance with fresh minerality.

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## CHASSAGNE-MONTRACHET

Chassagne annexed the name of its most famous *grand cru* in 1879. Its vineyards surface is 100 hectares larger than its neighbour's, Puligny-Montrachet, and both villages share the *grands crus* Bâtard-Montrachet, Criots-Bâtard-Montrachet and Montrachet. A particularity of Chassagne is that most of its soils are better suited to red grape varieties but the village owes its reputation to its white wines. In the mid-1970s, about 2/3 of Chassagne's production was red. Nowadays, it's the exact opposite with about 2/3 white.

### Domaine Armand-Heitz

The history of the Domaine can be traced back to 1857. Over the years, the family of Georges LocharDET acquired significant, prime vineyards in some of Burgundies top terroirs, totalling 20 hectares. When Georges passed away he left 50% of it to his son, Armand. For many years the winery sold its wines to Maison Drouhin, who also took care of the vineyards for the family. In 2011, after finishing his studies, Armand LocharDET's grandson (also named Armand) took charge of the estate. Under his youthful steer the Domaine has slowly been converting back to the Domaine's singular control, parcel by parcel, with Armand's first commercial wine released under the Domaine name in 2013.

This is now our third vintage importing Armand's wines. We are lucky to have such a wide variety of wines from this great Domaine which is really pushing the boundaries of what & how wines are being made in Burgundy, with a philosophy and approach that is Armand's trademark. To understand the Domaine have a look at their Instagram profile as this is very educational regarding the Domaine's philosophy.

### BOURGOGNE BLANC

From vine parcels located between Meursault and Chassagne Montrachet, and benefitting with characteristics from both appellations' terroirs, this is an excellent Bourgogne Blanc. Punching well above its weight there is lots of structure and points of interest. The nose is decidedly more Pinot Blanc (only 10% in the blend) - direct with crisp fruit character, but the body is richer and more Chardonnay rounded (90%). ### Domaine Jean-Claude Ramonet

One of the iconic producers of Burgundy. Run by Jean-Claude with the help of his two daughters Anne-France and now Clarisse who has joined the Domaine as well. The Domaine makes no less than four grands crus (Bâtard-Montrachet, Chevalier-Montrachet, Le Montrachet, Bienvenues-Bâtard-Montrachet), ten premiers crus in white and four in red. With a light touch on new oak (about 50% for the Grands Crus, 25% for the 1er Cru), the whites are beautifully dense, solid, and textured thanks to very little settling of solids before fermentation and extended lees contact prior to the first racking. Full, firm, and precise, the wines display intense minerality and excellently fresh, saline acidity.

The 1ere Tranche (first release) will be a late one as we should get our allocation around March depending on how the season progresses. As usual, the release will be POA – Price On Allocation -

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## CÔTE CHALONNAISE

### MERCUREY

Located in the heart of the Côte Chalonnaise, Mercurey - tucked away in the hillsides of the aptly-named “Golden Valley” - is protected from rain-bearing winds. The vines grow at heights of 230 to 320 metres on marl and limestone soils. The AOC status was instituted in 1923. There are no *grand cru* vineyards in Mercurey but about 170 hectares of (mostly red) *premier cru*. The red wines tend to be rich and full-bodied while the whites are often less obviously fruity than those of Rully or Montagny.

#### Domaine Tupinier-Bautista

Lutte Raisonnée

Manu Bautista replaced his stepfather at the helm of the 11 ha-domaine in 1997 located in the in the small hamlet of Touches. The Domaine includes 4 ha in the Mercurey Village appellation and 2 ha in the *premier Crus* of Sazenay, Les Vellées and Clos du Roy. In 2016, a new winery was built. The cellar was dug into the rock to keep a constant temperature and optimise the ageing of the wines in barrels. Manu is full of warm energy and enthusiasm. As with many good wine makers, there is something of Manu’s character in the wines he produces; generous, warmly textured, and full of interest.

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#### NEW BOURGOGNE BLANC “LA GARENNE”

2020 is the first vintage of this wine, whose fruit is sourced from a small parcel with soil rich in clay and limestone, just outside the Mercurey appellation.

It shows balance and readiness to drink, yet concentration and freshness, with citrus fruits, peach, and creamy notes. A regional label beyond expectations. **Tasted: December 2021 – EB**

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#### MERCUREY BLANC 1ER CRU SAZENAY - LIMITED

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#### BOURGOGNE ROUGE

This wine comes from 60-year-old vines on average, aged in oak barrels of 1, 2 and 3 years old for 12 months, blended in vats and ready to be bottled at the end of January.

Small berry fruits grace the palate with a lot of sweet spices and a good structure for a Bourgogne Rouge. **Tasted: December 2021 – EB**

The grapes come from vines between 60 and 70 years old planted at 270m above sea level. The incredibly low yields are reflected in the rich fruit and the great tannic structure. The 12 months of oak ageing gives the wine a smoky and spicy extra layer of flavours.

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**MERCUREY ROUGE 1ER CRU SAZENAY**

The grapes from this South-east facing slope are sorted in the vineyard and completely destemmed. Fermentation on the skins lasts for 20 days and after racking and pressing the wine is aged in oak barrels, (30% of which are new) for 12 months.

An elegant, floral nose with ripe and bright forest fruits and cherries. This is spicy and toasty. The tannins are firm yet silky and the finish is dry and fresh. **Tasted: December 2021 – EB**

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## GIVRY

Givry is essentially red wine country with 85% of its vineyard areas planted with Pinot Noir, half of those being *premiers crus*. Most of the vines are planted on clay-limestone soils, facing East-South-East or due South at altitudes between 240 and 280 metres. The wines from Givry were supposedly French King Henri IV's favourites!

### Domaine Nicolas Ragot

Lutte Raisonnée

Running the Domaine on his own since his father's retirement in 2008, Nicolas Ragot follows the principles of organic and sustainable viticulture. "There's no secret: to make good wine you need good grapes!" explains Nicolas. The results speak for themselves. Both whites and reds show real purity and depth. The 9 hectares of vineyards are located exclusively in Givry, including three *premier cru* AOCs. Nicolas uses a range of different vessels, concrete for alcoholic fermentation of his reds, foudres for ageing either colour and ferment his Chardonnay and stainless steel mainly for clarification.

In 2020 he added clay amphoras to this range to experiment both vinification and ageing, with very satisfying results on white winemaking.

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#### GIVRY BLANC CHAMP POUROT

This is a North-East facing slope which gives a delicate fruit, thus only 10% of new oak is used.

The nose offers ripe nectarine and mango. In the mouth it is ripe and rich with a precise finish.

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#### GIVRY BLANC TEPPE DES CHENÈVES

The grapes come from an East facing clay-limestone site. A third of this wine has been made in amphoras and the remaining in oak, of which 30% is new.

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## MONTAGNY

At the southern end of the Côte Chalonnaise, white wines only are made in the Montagny AOC. The monks of Cluny were very partial to them. Facing East and South-East, the Chardonnay is planted on hillsides at altitudes of 250-400 metres on marls and marl-limestone soils. About 2/3 of the vineyard area is categorised as *premier cru*.

### Domaine Stéphane Aladame

Organic (in conversion)

Montagny, like Rully and Givry, is another appellation where very good value for money can be found. Stéphane Aladame is one of the stars of the younger generation of Burgundy producers. Whereas many young winemakers inherit their estate, Stéphane began from scratch in 1992, at the age of 18. He completed his studies in Beaune before renting vineyards in Montagny, in the Côte Chalonnaise. The wines of Montagny can easily rival those from the more famous Côte de Beaune, which lies immediately to the North, and often at considerably better prices. Stéphane crafts honest and charming white wines.

#### MONTAGNY 1ER CRU DÉCOUVERTE - LIMITED

The fruit for this wine is sourced from the youngest vines planted in Les Maroques and Les Gouresses. Vinified exclusively in stainless- steel, it has a very zesty character with grapefruit and white peach on the nose and a good concentration and acidity. **Tasted: December 2021 – EB**

## MÂCONNAIS

### CLESSÉ

North of the town of Mâcon, four communes - including Clessé and Viré - form the Viré-Clessé appellation which was created in 1999 by the INAO. There are currently no *premier cru* vineyards in this relatively new appellation which produces dry white wines only.

#### Domaine du Mont Epin

Certified Organic

Owned by Richard and Stéphane Martin from Domaine de la Croix Senaillet, the Domaine is planted with Chardonnay only (15 hectares) on clay-limestone soils. The vines and the winery are both located in the commune of Clessé. The two brothers have recently added four new cuvées to their range: Mâcon-Péronne, L'Etoile, Viré-Clessé and Breillonde

#### VIRÉ-CLESSÉ BREILLONDE

##### Certified Organic

The grapes for the Viré-Clessé Breillonde come from an east facing site. This wine uses both stainless steel and demi-muids. A beautiful nose starts with white flowers, yellow

fruits and a distinct peach element. On the palate; fresh, saline with the sapidity flowing into a pleasing acid freshness. **Tasted: December 2021 – SB**

## DAVAYÉ

The Saint-Véran AOC, created in 1971, lies in the south of the Mâconnais region, forming a belt around the Pouilly-Fuissé appellation. Not unusually in Burgundy, the AOC spreads over a number of villages, including Davayé to the North-East of the rock of Solutré; a hill which the late President Francois Mitterrand enjoyed climbing up each year. Only white wines are produced in Saint-Véran.

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### Domaine de la Croix Senaillet

Domaine de la Croix Senaillet is located in Davayé, a little village near the famous prehistoric site of Solutré. Founded in the late 1960s by Maurice Martin, the domaine has been run since 1992 by his sons Richard and Stéphane. The former takes care of the vines while the latter oversees vinification. A certified organic since 2010, the domaine works without synthetic pesticides or chemical fertilisers.

The 25 hectares of Chardonnay extend over almost 60 different plots. Most of these plots face the rising sun, on gentle slopes that extend from the eastern hillsides of Solutré and Vergisson.

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### MACON DAVAYÉ BLANC

These south facing vineyards provide ripe stone fruit and melon. The palate is very refreshing with a chalky texture. **Tasted: December 2021 – EB**

The Domaine was founded in 2014 by Lucie and Marc-Antonin Blain who are siblings, giving the namesake of the Domaine. They have 14 acres of old vines on Mont Brouilly. The wines are vinified in Chassagne-Montrachet where Marc-Antonin prefers to work on infusion for his Brouilly's. They are currently undergoing a 10-year project of replanting to modernise the vineyards including it becoming fully Organic.

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#### BROUILLY

This wine undergoes 100% whole bunch pressing. A fruity, lively, and rounded wine. **Tasted: December 2021 – SB**

### La Combe Vineuse (Domaine Armand Heitz)

Armand Heitz, very attached to his region but in love with the French wine heritage above all, sets out to conquer the Beaujolais, a joint venture with his brother-in-law Augustin.

La Combe-Vineuse is composed of 6 hectares in Julié纳斯. 2018. They make a Beaujolais made in the traditional Burgundian method. The 6 hectares in Julié纳斯 produce wines which can be best described as having a focused freshness of fruit with finely balanced acidity and strong identities of terroir, displaying both complexities and great length. Armand is a big fan of Beaujolais, hence why he bought an estate in the region!

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#### JULIENAS - BEAUJOLAIS

In bottle. 100% whole bunch, this is the version in tank. Minimal sulphur. Heady and delicious bouquet, with some of the depth of Julié纳斯 but full of spice and life. The sweetness of fruit works very well for this style of wine, some dark liquorice notes to finish, with some spice too. Super-saturated by

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the fruit though. **Tasted: October 2021 – Jasper Morris, Inside Burgundy**

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### Domaine des Pierres Roses (Domaine Thibault Liger Belair)

Thibault Liger Belair whose wine we know and love in Nuits-Saint Georges has another Domaine 'Domaine des Pierres Roses' in Beaujolais. Thibault studied for a while in Belleville, Beaujolais and there he became fascinated with the beauty of the region and the quality and diversity of its soils. He decided to create a Burgundian model by isolating each terroir within the same appellation in order to try to understand it and then make the most of its identity.

He says that there are many similarities with the Burgundy model, both on wines and climates, as well as on the methods of winemaking and élevage and that the wines of the Beaujolais are the cousins of Burgundy.

The first plots were bought in 2008, in order for them to produce the first vintage in 2009. Thibault has reproduced all the same methods as those in Nuits-Saint-Georges by reintroducing ploughing while removing all weedkillers. He also converted all the plots of land from the first year to organic and the Biodynamic cultivation.

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#### MOULIN À VENT VIEILLES VIGNES

This cuvée is the flagship wine of the estate, comprising about 50% of the production. It is a blend of nine different parcels across the cru - all planted between 1910 - 1955. The shallow soil is composed of white and pink sand from pink granite and quartz between 30 and 60 cm deep. This blend offers a good density at the beginning of the mouth followed by a very interesting slowness due to the shallower and less mineral soil. **Tasted: December 2021 – SB**

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## Domaine des Terres Dorées

Jean-Paul Brun works his 39 ha-domaine the Burgundian way (rather than the semi-carbonic way). He reckons that a longer fermentation allows a better terroir expression. The must is fermented with the natural yeasts by inoculation of a starter that Jean-Paul prepares himself. Sulphur is kept at low levels to preserve the intensity and purity of the fruits.

A refreshing and lean Chardonnay vinified in stainless steel. The gentle *batonnage* provides a lovely texture and some bread crust notes.

All wines are offered subject to remaining unsold. As usual we will do our best to satisfy all requests, but we may have to come back to you with alternative suggestions. When we have finalised your order, we will issue an invoice for immediate settlement. This invoice will serve as our confirmation of your kind order. If you fail to pay for your EP wines within 14 days of your prepayment invoice, we then reserve the right to cancel your order.

Please note that we give priority to customers who support us every year and across the board.

The in-bond price excludes duty currently £13.38 per six bottles and VAT (currently 20%). When the wines are shipped (anytime until April 2023 for certain red wines), we will ask you for your storage/delivery instructions. If you want us to deliver, we will then issue an invoice for the duty, and VAT on both the original invoice value of the wines and the duty (yes, we do pay tax on tax!).

We also reserve the right to charge for onward delivery on any single delivery of less than 24 bottles (mixed) at the rate of £18.00 incl. VAT per delivery.

Delivery charges to Scotland (north of Glasgow/Edinburgh) and islands will be passed on at cost (please enquire). If you want us to store the wine for you in bond, we will transfer it to our customers’ paid reserves section at London City Bond. Storage charges are currently £9.60+VAT per dozen or £4.80+VAT per 6 bottle case (or smaller) per year or part thereof, to include insurance at full replacement value (subject to normal conditions).
